Course Title:	Behavior Based Safety
Regulatory & Technical Reference:	OSHA: OSTN Introduction to Behavior Based Safety NIOSH Publication 20029716: Behavior Based Safety: solution of the past or key to the future.
Target Groups:	All levels of employees required to have involvement or general knowledge on a Behavior Based Safety Program.
Prerequisites:	None.
Objective:	The course will provide personnel with knowledge in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- What Behavior Based Safety (BBS) is.</li><li>- How it can benefit employees and employers alike.</li><li>- Ways employees can actively participate in a BBS program.</li></ul>
Course Design:	This course covers the importance of a Behavior Based Safety Program, how it can improve employee safety and morale, how it can be beneficial to employers, how employee attitude and behavior can greatly affect a BBS program, how employees can correct unsafe behaviors and participate in a BBS program.
Completion Requirements:	Classroom presentation followed by a closed book examination, which requires at least a 70% for successful completion
Course Length:	1 – 2 hours.
Class Size:	1 – 20 students.
