



Bloodborne Pathogens

Course Title:	Bloodborne Pathogens
Regulatory & Technical Reference:	29 CFR 1930.1030 Toxic and Hazardous Substances
Target Groups:	Employee(s) with occupational exposure (i.e., reasonably anticipated skin, eye, mucous membrane, or parenteral contact with blood or other potentially infectious materials (OPIM) that may result from the performance of the employee's duties).
Prerequisites:	None.
Objective:	This course will provide training for personnel who can be exposed to Bloodborne Pathogens (BBP) as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- What is a bloodborne pathogen and where can it be found.- Which are the most concerning pathogens.- How an employee can be exposed to a pathogen- How to prevent an exposure.
Course Design:	This classroom segment of this course is designed to inform employees on Bloodborne pathogens, which are the most common, how they can be transmitted, how exposure can occur, how to prevent occupational exposures, and what to do if an employee was to be exposed.
Completion Requirements:	Classroom presentation followed by a closed book examination, which requires at least a 70% for successful completion
Course Length:	1 – 2 hours.
Class Size:	1 – 20 students.
