

Course Title:	Fire Protection w/ Field Exercise
Regulatory & Technical Reference:	OSHA 1910 Subpart L (1910.155 through 1910.165)
Target Groups:	All levels of employees required to have Basic Fire Protection training or be involved and have general knowledge in fire training.
Prerequisites:	None.
Objective:	The purpose of this course is not to train people to be fire fighters but to train them to recognize the fire hazards and react accordingly. The employer shall provide an educational program to familiarize the employees with the general principle of fire extinguisher use and the hazards involved with incipient stages of firefighting. The course outline includes fire watch responsibilities, the principle of fire and prevention, classes of fire, fire extinguishers, and the use of fire extinguishers.
Course Design:	The course will include a classroom segment that will cover types of fires, types of extinguishers, extinguishing agents, components of combustion, fire prevention, fire control techniques, and functions and operations of portable extinguishers including the P.A.S.S. method.
Completion Requirements:	Classroom presentation followed by a closed book examination, which requires at least a 70% for successful completion.
Course Length:	2 hours.
Class Size:	1 – 20 students.
