



## Incipient Fire Fighting (Fire Watch)

Course Title:	Incipient Fire Fighting (Fire Watch)
Regulatory & Technical Reference:	29 CFR 1910.252 (a) 30 CFR 250 subpart A 29 CFR 1910.157 29 CFR 1926.150
Target Groups:	All levels of employees required to have Basic Fire Training or have involvement and general knowledge in hot work or fire watch activities.
Prerequisites:	None.
Objective:	This course will provide personnel with knowledge in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Why Incipient Fire Fighting training is necessary.</li><li>- Knowledge in the different types of fires and equipment.</li><li>- How to properly discharge a portable fire extinguisher.</li><li>- Fire watch attendant requirements.</li></ul>
Course Design:	This course covers the importance of Fire Prevention in the work place, what are the different types of fires and extinguishing agents, what the regulations are in regards to fire protection, practicing with a hand held portable fire extinguisher, and what are the rules to being a fire watch attendant.
Completion Requirements:	Classroom presentation & hands on practical followed by a closed book examination, which requires at least a 70% for successful completion.
Course Length:	2 – 3 hours.
Class Size:	1 – 20 students.
