



## OSHA 30 – General, Construction, & Marine Industry

Course Title:	OSHA 30 – General Industry, Construction, & Marine
Regulatory & Technical Reference:	OSHA
Target Groups:	This course is appropriate for supervisors or workers with some safety responsibility.
Prerequisites:	None.
Objective:	This program is intended to provide training for workers and employers on the recognition, avoidance, abatement, and prevention of safety and health hazards in workplaces in each of these industries. The program also provides information regarding workers' rights, employer responsibilities, and how to file a complaint. It is intended to provide a variety of training to workers with some safety responsibility. Training should emphasize hazard identification, avoidance, control and prevention, not OSHA standards.
Course Design:	This course covers the following topics: introduction to OSHA standards, general safety and health provisions, safety programs, occupational health and environmental controls, hazard communication, PPE, lifesaving equipment, fire protection and prevention, motor vehicles, equipment, marine operations, rollover protective structures, overhead protection and signs, signals and barricades, excavations, concrete and masonry construction, materials handling, rigging, tools/hand and power, machine guarding, welding and cutting, electrical, scaffolding, fall protection, cranes, derricks, hoists, elevators, conveyors, stairways and ladders, and confined space entry.
Completion Requirements:	Classroom presentation followed by a closed book examination, which requires at least a 70% for successful completion.
Course Length:	30 Hours (7.5 hours maximum / day)
Class Size:	1 – 40
